From the Presidents' Keyboard

Dear Guild Members,

We are planning on an outside in-person guild meeting on May 11th! The area around the church is really a mess right now with construction on Ridgeview. So, we plan to hold our May guild meeting at the Sunset Pavilion, a covered outdoor facility on the campus of the Johnson County Government Plaza at 119th and Ridgeview. The complex itself is on the northwest corner of that intersection, and the pavilion is on the southeast corner of that complex, near the lovely Master Gardeners Garden Gallery. You can enter the area from either Ridgeview or 119th, but the closest entrance to the pavilion is on 119th just west of Ridgeview, across from the Sonic. Parking is allowed near the pavilion, and when that fills up there is plenty of parking just north of the buildings.

According to county guidelines, wearing of masks in public spaces is required if unable to maintain a 6 foot distance between individuals with only infrequent or incidental moments of closer proximity. So, please use your own judgement with regard to your safety and that your fellow guild members. If county guidelines change before our meeting, an announcement will be made.

Be aware that it is possible bathrooms will be available, but we cannot count on it. This 26' x 60' space has 4 picnic tables and 8 benches. If we could reposition the picnic tables and benches prior to the meeting, that would be great, but they are very heavy. My husband and I will begin seeing what we can do, beginning at about 5:30 p.m. If anyone is available to help, please join us. It might be a good idea to put a chair in your car, just in case you need one. Ashley and Matt Copeland will provide sound and lights for us.

Before and after our speaker, **several normal guild activities will take place:** actually signing in at the Welcome Table, distribution of KCRQF tickets and merchandise you ordered, wrapping up the 2020 Challenge Quilt projects, and Ways and Means opportunities – bring your dollars! As usual, we will end with Show and Tell! The wrap-up of the 2020 Block of the Month activity is planned for our June meeting.

If the weather looks bad the day before our planned May meeting, we will switch to a Zoom meeting, with our same scheduled speaker, Barb Eikmeier. We will make an announcement 24 hours prior to the meeting.

Let's hope we get to see each other again for our 6:30 p.m. meeting on May 11th!

MAY PROGRAM — Just Solids by Barb Eikmeier

Historically, solids appeared in Amish and Hawaiian quilts, and quilts from the 30's. Today they are popular in modern quilts. Some quilters love solids. Others don't. There is something for every taste in this collection of quilts made with Just Solids. See contemporary and traditional examples, and international textiles as you hear Barb's stories about her love affair with solids.

Barb Eikmeier has been quilting since 1984 and teaching quilting 1990. She is the author of four books published by Martingale and Co. including "Back Basting Applique Step by Step." she is a fabric designer for Paintbrush Studio Fabrics and a Blueprint instructor (formerly Craftsy). In 2016 she became the authorized distributor for the Magic Triangle Ruler. Married to a retired army officer she has lived in several regions of the US and Korea. Barb considers herself a traditional quilter and applique is her favorite quilting technique. She lives in Lansing KS with her husband Dale and two dogs.

Machine Stitched Applique

Tuesday, May 25, 2021 6 p.m. – 8 p.m.

We will use basic machine applique with the words, Live, Laugh, and Love to create a 12" X12" project. You can make a pillow cover, a wall hanging, or a table topper. After the application process is taught, we will quilt and bind the pillow top/wall hanging/table topper.

Block of the Month

May star of the month:

- A. Cut 8 squares 1 1/2 inches of one dark print.
- B. Cut 8 squares 1 1/2 inches of one light print.
- C. Cut 2 squares 3 1/4 inches of light print.
- D. Cut 2 squares 3 1/4 inches of a dark print.
- E. Cut 1 square 2 1/2 for center .

Assemble A and B squares to form a four patch, make 4.



Draw a diagonal line through the light C squares, stack them with the D squares and sew 1/4 inches on each side. Press.







Draw a diagonal line on the C / D units and sew 1/4 inch on each side of the line. Press.





Assemble as shown in picture to form a Ohio star variation.



Notice how I used 2 different lights with the same value. Dig in that stash to make this 6 1/2 inch block.



As of the last Wednesday in April, Missouri Sewing Machine finally has most (not all) of their classes to the board & they are online. There are 3 more coming and are listed in the MSM newsletter but the details are not all available for the board to add them to the website. Quilters HQ has cancelled 4 poor attendance classes & added another Jacquie Gering walking foot class & a second section of a ruler class that was also sold out. So go check out the new classes!

The virtual meeting of the members of Olathe Quilter's Guild was opened by President Libby Corriston at 6:30pm by Zoom. Libby welcomed new member: Bianca Elliot.

Program: Diane Murtha shared some challenge projects she had made, her process for designing challenge quilts. She also discussed how to find and participate in a variety of quilting challenges, and how these challenges can help you stretch and grow your quilting skills

Business Meeting: Cheryl Wilcox made a motion to accept the secretary's minutes of the March minutes. It was seconded by Rachel Rohrer and approved. Jean Heer made a motion to accept the treasurer's report from March. It was seconded by Melissa Toburen and approved.

April birthdays were recognized.

Members were thanked for responding to the survey about May and June meetings. Discussion included weather, indoor and outdoor issues and some of the options available to address those concerns.
