We have seen many wonderful quilt projects this year in our Show and Tells. We really want you to bring them to the fair. There are many different classes(types) of quilts that can be entered. Why not challenge yourself to enter in 2 or 3 classes. Entries are judged in three age groups—19 and older—12-18 years old or 11 years old and under. Have you been making a quilt with a young quilter? Encourage them to enter, too.

Entering your quilts is done online through the www.jocokansasfair.com website. Drop-off times are Monday evening August 1 and Tuesday morning August 2. The quilts will be released Sunday morning, August 7.

Block of the Month

Here is your June block of the month. Make sure you include polka dots somewhere on the block.



Nitetime Needlers Block *June*

This block was chosen by the Nitetime Needlers.

Cutting Instructions

<p>Fabric A – yellow ✓(8) 3 1/2" squares ✓(2) 3 1/4" squares <i>date</i></p> <p>Fabric C – raspberry none</p> <p>Fabric E – white none</p>	<p>Fabric B – lime ✓(2) 3 1/2" squares ✓(1) 2 1/2" square <i>blue</i></p> <p>Fabric D – blue ✓(4) 3" squares ✓(2) 3 1/4" squares ✓(4) 2 1/2" x 5 1/2" <i>pink</i></p> <p>Fabric F – black none</p>

Draw a diagonal line on 2 of the Fabric A 3 1/2" squares. Match this fabric, right sides together with Fabric B 3 1/2" squares. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut the piece in half on the drawn line. You have created 4 HST units. Press and square up to 3".

Draw a diagonal line on the Fabric A 3 1/4" squares. Match these squares with Fabric D 3" squares. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Don't cut between the sewn lines yet. Cut on the other diagonal line on Fabric A that is running perpendicular of the sewn lines. Now cut between the sewn lines. These two squares will yield a total of 8 triangle units.

Diagonally subcut the remaining four Fabric A 3 1/2" squares to create a total of 8 triangles. Pair these, right sides together with the triangle units from above. Square up these blocks to 3". Make sure you divide these into 2 different stacks of 4, based on where the Fabric A small triangle is.

Create a four-patch using 1 of each of the units created above along with the Fabric D 3" square. Refer to the picture at the right for placement. Make four identical units. This corner unit should measure 5 1/2" square.

Create the center section by sewing a Fabric D 2 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangle on either side of Fabric B 2 1/2" square.

Sew a corner unit on each side of Fabric D 2 1/2" x 5 1/2" rectangle like the picture at the right. Make a second one of these.

Finish the block by sewing the three sections together. Make sure the Fabric B triangles are on the interior of the block. Block will measure 12 1/2".
