Our August Speaker Martha Walker

Martha Walker has been making quilts since she was a teen, and enjoys every aspect of quilt making including biecework, appliqué and quilting. In addition to designing quilts, she designs projects in a variety of needle arts such as wool appliqué, punch needle and hooked rugs. She publishes patterns through her company, Wagons West Designs, and is most recently the author of *Prairie Patchwork: Treasured Quilts and Tales of Time* (Martingale Publishing), as well as *Betsy's Scrapbag, Annie's Scrapbag*, "Be Merry: Quilts and Projects for Your Holiday Home" (Kansas City Star Quilts) and "Vintage Christmas". Martha has designed three fabric lines for Henry Glass Fabrics and Co. and Studio e Fabrics.

Martha began exhibiting her original designs in 1994 and has won numerous awards including ribbons at American Quilter's Society Quilt Show (2000, 2007, 2023), International Quilt Festival (2005), National Quilter's Association Quilt Show (2005), Pacific International Quilt Festival (2006), Road to California (2001, 2002), Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival (2002), and The Arizona Quilter's Guild Quilt Show (1996, 1999, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2007).

Her quilts and designs have been featured in many publications including The Big Book of Favorite Scrap Quilts (Martingale Publishing), Primitive Quilts and Projects Magazine, Simply Vintage, Quiltmania, Quilts from Quiltmaker's 100 Blocks, Quilt Country, Magic Patch, Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, and Quiltmaker's 100 Blocks from today's top designers.



## Meeting Minutes

### Olathe Quilt Guild Minutes July 8, 2025

Vice President Jenny Boudreaux called the meeting to order. Fifty five members were present. There were five visitors who joined before the evening was over. Three members joined us via Zoom. Peggy Anderson introduced Linda Bratten who presented Telling Your Story – Creating Labels for Quilts.

#### **BUSINESS MEETING**

**Secretary's Minutes** – Dae Curtiss moved that the minutes from the June meeting, as printed in the newsletter, be approved. Melissa Toburen seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

**Budget increases** – Jenny told us that the Website/Zoom budget cost went from \$300 to \$900 for two years, the WIX charge is \$576 for two years and Zoom was \$175 last year and is due in December. Mary Ellen Winter moved that these expenses be approved. Dae Curtis seconded the motion and it passed without objection.

**Treasurer's Report** – Karen Lacy moved that the report, as printed in the newsletter, be approved. Lisa Hirsch seconded the motion which passed unanimously. Jenny announced the July birthdays.

**KCRQF** – Dae Curtiss told us the final dollar figures are not available yet. The guild representatives for the 2027 festival are encouraged to attend the August meeting. Anyone interested in serving in this capacity is encouraged to speak up. It is best to have two people to share the load and provide coverage if the primary representative is unavailable to attend a meeting. We expect to receive our check in August or September. Dae and Pat Lawson provided refreshments to thank members for volunteering during the festival.

**Outreach/Education** – Jenny The next KSU extension class is Reusable Gift Bag by Mary Pacey on July 16<sup>th</sup>. There is a sign-up to help with the class. We received a special rate of \$100 total for tables at both the July and August 4<sup>th</sup> Friday on the square in downtown Olathe. We will sell Opportunity Quilt tickets and any other items anyone would like to offer for the guild to sell. Dae moved that we do this, Heather Schaller seconded the motion, and it passed without dissent.

**Field Trip** – Jenny told us the date for the trip to Kansas State's Textile and Clothing Museum in Manhattan is set for Saturday October 18th. We will need to leave no later than 7:30 for the 10:00 program. There will be a sign-up sheet. When it is determined how many are attending, a cost analysis will be done to see if we will carpool or get a bus. Julie Coons is a bus driver and will see what she can get a bus for. The guild will pay mileage or for the bus. The trip is a way to share the proceeds from the Estate Sale.

**Programs** – Peggy Anderson told us the August program is Yesterday's Stories in Today's Quilts by Martha Walker.

**Charity** – Lou Corbin has quilt kits ready for quilting or tying. Several quilts have been returned either finished or ready for binding. The quilts this year are going to foster or homeless children in the Olathe Public Schools, the Olathe Police Department, and seniors.

**Johnson County Fair** – Shelia still has three open spots for volunteers. She reminded us that entries must be received by July 14<sup>th</sup> and encouraged us to look at the categories for various types of quilts and other areas of interest. The dates are July 27<sup>th</sup> – August 2<sup>nd</sup>.

**Retreat** – Heather Schaller said the fall retreat will be Friday October 24<sup>th</sup> through Monday October 27<sup>th</sup> at Evergreen on Sunset near 119<sup>th</sup> and Ridgeview. This is the same venue as last spring. The room is large enough for 20 plus quilters with individual tables. The lighting and amenities are good. You come and go as you wish during that time and leave your supplies in the secure building while you go home to sleep in your own beds. Let Heather know via text or email if you are interested in attending.

**Hand Quilters** - Karen Lacy said they will meet on Thursday the 17<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm at the church.

**Welcome Table** – Cheryl Wilcox won the door prize. Heather Rutler won the quilt book that was offered on a separate ticket drawing.

**Ways and Means** had three prizes that were all won by Kenda Camp. Board meeting is July the 15<sup>th</sup> via Zoom. Show and Tell finished the meeting.


