## February K-State Extension Workshop Presentation

Tuesday, Feb. 23 from 6-8 p.m.

### Bullseye Quilt

Here is a quilt that helps you use up bits and pieces of fabrics leftover from previous projects or fabrics that are no longer your favorites. This quilt becomes beautiful with an abundant variety of fabrics. The biggest fabric piece used is a 9” square. This workshop will demonstrate the ease in stitching the blocks. This finished quilt has sewn circles with raw edges which will “soften” after several washings.

# Charity Update

Our guild is made up of many people with big hearts. In 2020, we donated **46 quilts** and **4 afghans** to the Veterans. We also donated **35 quilts** and **one pillowcase** to Project Warm Embrace. I'm not sure of the number of premie blankets but we donated some of those, also. Thank you!!! You all make a difference and together we make a big difference.

The 2021 charity committee has chosen recipients for this year. They are:

**Veterans.** Linda Hagen will continue to champion this. They are very appreciative of all we have done for them and don't have any restrictions. They are using our donations to help transitioning vets who have been in the hospital for a long time and for ones transitioning from being homeless.

**Habitat.** Janie Benander will champion this. They put together welcome baskets for new homeowners at the rate of a couple per month. They will gladly take our donations but we need to commit to 24 for the year. We would like to supply them with a minimum of 24 kitchen towels and 24 pillowcases. Obviously, it would be lovely if these were all pairs instead of singles. We will have kits and directions available for you from donated fabric or you can make and donate from your stash.

**Senior Communities.** Heather Schaller will champion this. We plan to donate to as many senior communities in Olathe as we can. Needs are many. Some ideas to start with are walker bags, wheelchair lap quilts, fidget quilts, and throw quilts for naps and extra warmth as they sleep.

If you have an additional project that you love making, contact one of the ladies and see if their recipient can use it. I know that we all have fun items that we like to make. These charities give us all freedom to help in any way we like.

Remember that we have donated fabric if you want some, let me know. We also still have quilt tops that need to be finished.

# Block of the Month & KCRQF Classes

Here is the block #2 for the 2021 BOM. It is a 6 1/2" by 6 1/2" finished block.

- A. Make 12 squares 2 X 2 of light print
  - B. Make 4 rectangles 2 X 3 1/2 of dark print
  - C. Make 4 rectangles 2 X 3 1/2 of medium print
  - D. Make 4 squares 2 X 2 of another light print.
1. Draw a diagonal line on back of squares and put one square on each side of the rectangles (see picture).
  2. Sew one of the dark print blocks to the medium print block.
  3. Sew these 4 blocks to form a star. See picture.

I used a different print but the same value for the 12 squares, to satisfy the rules.

# KCRQF Update—#1

## KCRQF MERCHANDISE DETAILS

It's time to start ordering merchandise for the 2021 Festival! Contact Heather Buchwitz for any questions.

Q – How do I order?

A – Use this link - <https://bit.ly/2021kcrqfGuildPreOrder>

Q – Is Olathe Quilt Guild subsidizing our tickets again?

A – YES. In past years Olathe Guild has provided \$5 towards your single or 3day ticket purchase. You can purchase tickets for friends – but you only get a single \$5 discount. You only get this if you order through the above link.

Q – Should I order via the [www.kcrqf.com](http://www.kcrqf.com) website?

A – Preferably not. The orders through the KCRQF website for merchandise will not be deliverable prior to the show, tickets purchased through the website will not qualify for the \$5 guild subsidy. That said – you totally CAN. If you are signing up for a class & want to order your Tshirt & pin there feel free. You will have to pick it up at the festival.

Q – What if I change my mind?

A – If you order through the PreOrder link above you have until the end of March to let Heather or Mary Ellen know that you changed your mind. If you order through [kcrqf.com](http://kcrqf.com) the order is not refundable or editable.

Q – How do I pay?

A – Rachel Rohrer will receive a list of Olathe Guild member orders & send you an invoice. She will be using Square to make the invoices and you will see it come in your email. It won't be same-day – we (KCRQF) are not sending out daily updates to guilds of orders at this point. You may not see your invoice for a few weeks.

Q – Ok I'm getting an invoice – but how do I pay?

A – The Olathe Guild board has agree that we will use Square – but we WILL lose part of your payment if you pay by credit card. The board would LOVE if you mail a check to the P.O. Box. The address will be on your invoice. If you mail in cash or check the guild keeps all of the money to pay KCRQF for your order. We understand that doesn't work for everybody and near the end of March you will likely not have time to send in a check in time.

Q – When is payment due to Olathe Quilters Guild?

A – As soon as possible when you receive the invoice. Any orders not paid by 3/31/2021 will not be guaranteed. The festival will order some extra merchandise but it will be sold first-come first-serve. Olathe will not include your order in the guaranteed merchandise order we submit on 3/31/2021 if we do not have your payment to send along to the festival.

Q – Where & when will I pick up my merchandise?

A – Tentatively Mary Ellen & Heather (on behalf of the festival) are planning to distribute merchandise to all of the guilds in May. After that point all of the guilds will have to figure out their own distribution process. We are planning (for Olathe Guild specifically) to distribute at our May or June meeting which will hopefully be in person! If we don't have an in person meeting (at least in the parking lot) we will set up a date & time to meet at the church & let you come pick up. If you don't pick it up then we will have it at the merchandise booth for pickup during the festival.

Q – Can I buy a ticket at the festival?

A – Yes – but nobody wins except the OPCC in that scenario so PLEASE plan ahead! We will continue to take ticket orders up until the end through the pre-order link & the KCRQF website.

## KCRQF Quilt Guild Showcase

To provide an explanation for our new members, our guild will once again participate in the **KCRQF June 17-19, 2021**. Each guild member will have the opportunity to potentially display a quilt completed during the past two years. Sizes must be between 24-inches square up to 96-inches square. Quilts must include a 4-inch rod pocket for hanging.

In this month's newsletter (next page), you will find the KCRQF application form for your quilt. This form must be completed & submitted along with a picture of your quilt, and emailed to [kathleen.manning1@verizon.net](mailto:kathleen.manning1@verizon.net) no later than **February 28<sup>th</sup>**. (If you have any questions, call Kathleen 703.909.0812; or Janice 913.754.6880.) Information on this application form will be used for quilt labeling. We will enter your information into the KCRQF website if your quilt is selected for display.

During our March guild meeting, a random selection process will take place. All quilt display requests we have received by February 28<sup>th</sup> will be included in this selection process. During our March meeting, our normal Show N Tell will be a PowerPoint presentation of these quilts submitted for the KCRQF display. Once we determine the number of quilts and space limitation outlined by KCRQF, we will notify you by email regarding your quilt display acceptance.

## Johnson County Parks & Recreation January Virtual Program

Starting Feb. 6th - April 20th there will be a [traveling exhibit at the Johnson County Museum](#) showing 41 examples of garments and other household items fashioned year ago using feed sacks. This is a traveling exhibit which explores the reuse of feed sacks to make clothing and other household objects and illuminates how the “upcycling” of these bags mutually benefitted twentieth-century consumers and businesses. “**Thrift Style**” serves as an example of past ingenuity that can inform today’s efforts towards sustainability. This exhibition offers a snapshot of domestic life during a time when recycling was as critical as it is today.

January 12, 2021

Mary Ellen introduced speaker Lyn Heilman who gave a program, All About Batting. Lyn offered a prize of a package of Thermore insulating batting to those attending. Karen Genis used a random name picker which was a computer generated rotating wheel, and the winner was Jean Heer. At the end of the program another winner was Cheryl Wilcox, who answered a question first and won a package of batting. Lyn also offered a code for a 10% discount until January 14<sup>th</sup>.

Mary Ellen Winter made a motion to approve the December minutes. It was seconded by Sheila Pierce and accepted. Linda Hagen made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. It was seconded by Cheryl Wilcox and accepted. Mary Pacey made a motion to accept the 2021 budget, Lisa Hirsch seconded and the motion was accepted.

## Tips for joining Zoom:

### Downloading the Zoom client

You can download the Zoom Desktop Client for [Mac](#), [Windows](#), [ChromeOS](#) and [Linux](#), as well as the Zoom Mobile App for [iOS](#) and [Android](#) from our [Downloads](#) page.



### Joining another user's meeting

There are many ways to [join a meeting](#), but the easiest way is to click the join link that the meeting host provided. You can also click **Join** in your Zoom client and enter the meeting ID.



Join

As a guild member, you will receive an email with the Zoom link to join our monthly meeting. At the time of the meeting, you will click on the link to enter a Zoom meeting room. You click the “Join” button pictured above. Please make sure your name is entered into your profile. Then meeting host will admit you to the meeting.

The guild asks that everyone keep their microphone on **Mute** so we can hear the presenters and speakers.

Here are a few more tips to remember:

- If you keep your camera on, remember we can see everything you do and everything happening behind you.
- In the bottom center of the screen is a “Chat” feature. You can send messages to the whole group or private messages to individuals.
- If you have a question for the speaker, please put it in the “Chat”.
- If you invite a guest, please let Karen Genis know, so she can let the guest into our Zoom meeting (since she is the host, she can admit people to our Zoom meeting even if they are not a guild member).
