

UPDATED Directions for getting to Olathe Christian Church for the Olathe Quilters Guild meeting

Though conditions on Ridgeview are improving, the best ways to get to the church remain the same, where we cross Ridgeview on either Stagecoach Drive or Sunvale Terrace:

Coming from the north:

Just east of the I-35 and 135th St. intersection, take Clairborne Rd. south about 1.3 miles.
At E. Sunvale Terrace (not Sunvale Drive), turn right/west.
Take Sunvale Terrace to Ridgeview and then drive across Ridgeview to the church.

Coming from the south:

From 151st and Ridgeview, take Ridgeview north to E. Sheridan Bridge Lane.
Turn right onto E. Sheridan Bridge Lane and drive about 0.5 mile. (You'll be heading northeast.)
At E. Stagecoach Drive, turn left and drive about 0.5 mile. (You'll be heading northwest.)
When you come to Ridgeview, cross the road to the church.

Coming from the east on 151st:

Turn right/north onto Lindenwood Drive. Drive about 0.7 mile.
Turn left/west onto Sheridan Bridge Lane. (You'll head west and then southwest.) Drive about 0.2 mile.
Turn right onto Stagecoach Drive and drive 0.5 mile. (You'll be heading northwest.)
Cross Ridgeview into the church parking lot.

Batting scraps - 20" X 16" or larger		Flannel pieces for the back of the quilts – 20" X 16" or larger

Block of the Month

September BOM

- A. Cut 16 squares 1 1/2 inches of star fabric.
 - B. Cut 4 rectangles 2 1/2 inches by 1 1/2 of a dark print
 - C. Cut 5 squares 2 1/2 inches of background.
 - D. Cut 4 rectangles 1 1/2 by 2 1/2 of background.
- I used 2 different fabrics but the same value for background.

Draw a diagonal line on the A squares.



Pair them with the B squares, sew on the line, trim 1/4 inches and press. Repeat on the other side making flying geese.



Sew a A square on all 4 sides of the center square, and one on the corner of the other C squares.



Join the flying geese to the D rectangles.



Assemble as shown in the picture.
Hope you enjoy the 6 1/2 inch star block.

Zoom Account for our Guild

Should the OQG have our own Zoom account?

During this last year, Karen Genis offered to handle our winter COVID meetings and all of our board meetings on Zoom, since she had access through her teaching position in the Olathe School District. This option is no longer available to her or to us. Members of our board, and many of our current committee chairs, all agree that it would be a good idea if we had our own Zoom account. The Pro plan for Zoom costs \$149 per year. It allows for up to 100 participants and no time limit on the meetings. (Actually, there is a 30-hour time limit for each meeting.) Comments from the board and committee chairs include the following:

We were able to save the expense during this last year, but it's time now to have our own account.

We may need to have meetings online again because of COVID, so it's good to have this option. We can afford it. The price is really reasonable.

This will allow us to be prepared.

Zoom is easier than Microsoft Teams and we are used to Zoom. We don't want to learn how to navigate another platform.

The 2021 board decided to continue board meetings on Zoom, which we could continue to do. Maybe we could have break-out groups within a Zoom meeting.

Some speakers prefer to give their programs on Zoom.

Small groups could meet if they wished, without the 40-minute time limit in the free Zoom account.

We do not want to lose our face-to-face meetings with the exchange of ideas and creative thinking that happens. Zoom should not be our preferred way to meet. But, in this day and age, we need to be flexible to meet challenges that arise.

We are lucky to have this option. Some guilds either suspended meeting or shut down completely last year.

We can sign up for one year of Zoom and decide on future years later.

Our guild Policies and Procedures state that "Any expenditure of money not already allocated in the annual budget must be presented to the Guild membership if the amount of the expenditures exceeds \$100. Any such expenditure shall be approved by the majority vote of the members present at the meeting."

We will discuss this topic briefly at the September meeting with time for questions, and then hold a vote.

The President thanked everyone who assisted with the Open Quilting Division of the Johnson County Fair and they stood to applause. She announced that she and Peggy Anderson will organize the fair show next year.

Program: Mary Ellen Winter introduced Mary Honas and her program "Stitching Your Memories into Quilts." Mary works for Harper's Fabrics, and is also the owner of First Rate Designs.

Business Meeting:

Karen Lacy made a motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting as printed in the newsletter. It was seconded by Pauline Sanders and was accepted.

Jessie VandenBerg made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as printed. It was seconded by Kenda Camp and approved.

Birthdays in August were recognized and congratulated.

Election: Most of the 2022 board has been filled as follows: President Libby Corrison, Vice President Nic Deplazes, Program Chairs Cindy Nice and Lisa Hirsch, Treasurer Ava Wright, Historian Cheryl Wilcox, Ways and Means Chairman Carol Crane, Public Relations Chairman Melissa Toburen, Membership Chairman Jean Heer, Advisor Teresa Jones. 2021 Challenge: Sherri Irving said these quilts should also be finished by February. She has a friend who needs a quilt finished by hand quilting and asked someone to offer, to be paid.

Charity: Cindy Nice announced that 23 people turned in points sheets for charity work completed, and Mary Pacey has been keeping track. A drawing was held and Carol Crane won a quilt made by Lisa Hirsch with fabrics overdyed by Cindy and Lisa. Another quilt was given to the top producer, Pauline Sanders.


Comments from our Guild Historian


