

JANUARY PRESENTATION

January's presentation was by Denise Stahl, the Curious Kansas Quilter. Denise went through her journey to becoming a quilt designer, educator, and avid quilter. She works at Mea Bernina at 2120 West 25th. in Lawrence, where you can buy fabric, take classes, and get helpful expert advice. Here are some of her amazing quilts that she displayed during her presentation.



SPOTLIGHT QUILTER - GRETCHEN SCHAFFER

I grew up in a very small, rural town called Cedarville, Michigan, and lived on an island in Lake Huron. The schools in the area are all K-12 (in one building still today). Yes, I'm a "Youper". My mom taught me how to sew when I was 9, through the 4-H program. I love to sew.

I didn't get into quilting until after I was married and lived in Ohio, and then I only quilted for a few years until I moved to Kansas in 2010. The quilt shops were few and far between in Ohio back in the early 90's. I have been an avid scrapbooker and card maker for over 20 years though. So, realistically, I'm a new quilter. I haven't been quilting for very long. I also knit, crochet and cross-stitch.

I love to try all different types of techniques and have recently taken classes in Hawaiian quilting, wool applique, English paper piecing and recently, the Judy Niemeyer paper piecing technique. I have decided I really like paper piecing and enjoy the process, except tearing out the paper.

My favorite quilting tools are just the basics. Machine, mat, ruler and rotary cutter. It's what makes quilting so much faster and easier today than when I started back in the early 90's. Although, even then they had mats, rulers and rotary cutters, not everyone could afford such luxury back then, and cereal box templates were the way I started out. Now, I absolutely LOVE the new rulers for so many quilt patterns that make cutting and assembling so much easier and faster. We have become the "ruler" quilters. I bet many of us have a lot of these new rulers. I know I have a lot of them.

When we moved to Kansas my daughters were now in the "working" world and it wasn't as easy to make new friends. I found there were lots of quilt shops around here and you could even learn to long arm at a couple of them. I took a long arm class so I could learn how to finish my quilt tops up a lot faster than tying or hand quilting them. I was a fast learner and was quickly asked if I would like a job. I worked for Quilted Memories for a couple of years and saved my paychecks to buy my own long arm and now I quilt for myself and charities. Through my job, I have made many wonderful quilting friends and love all the retreats and sew days I get to spend quilting with them.

I'm currently the Chair for the Greater Kansas City Quilters Guild Quilt Show coming up in August of 2020 and am co-chair for programs with Mary Ellen in our Olathe Guild. I host a quilt bee at my house once a month with friends and quilt quilts for several charities. I'm definitely keeping busy.

I have decided that this year I'm not taking on any "guild" challenges and am going to work on quilts I have wanted to make for many years. I buy a pattern and fabric and put them in a bag and the bag still sits there because there is always something else that comes up. Well, this year I'm going to try to resist the new stuff and work on my older stuff. Time will tell what wins. Lol

UFO's? Yes, I always have them. Usually between 15-25 in any given year. I do make an effort to work on them throughout the year, between other projects, and have gotten many done in just the past year. I think the reason they don't get done is the time it takes to make just one block.

Now that I'm retired, I quilt almost every day and love making quilts and trying new techniques. I'm still learning, and loving every day that I get a chance to help someone with a quilt or make a quilt for a family member or friend. I do a bit of traveling to visit family and friends and love to check out all the quilt shops in other parts of the country and see the different types of fabrics that are more prevalent in their areas.




NEW FOR 2020 - MEMBER MARKETPLACE!

WAYS AND MEANS





2020 BLOCK OF THE MONTH (BOM) - FEBRUARY

I want to thank everyone who participated in the 2019 BOM. It was fun to see everyone's creativity. I have included the 2 blocks for this month as attachments. I have decided to do the blocks with a 6" finish. A hint I learned as I was putting the Snail's Trail together - watch placement of 1/2 square triangles. One got turned 3 times before I finally got it right!!! Since the group decided 1 block is all you need, in many ways this is a block of the month you can transform into a row by row or just do a block a month and add some connector blocks for sashing. In order to scan these and have the colors preserved I need to scan as a Jpeg document. Keep that in mind as you're opening the documents. - Carolyn Chaffin



MINUTES AND REPORTS

Meeting Minutes Olathe Quilter's Guild January 14, 2020

The January Guild meeting was opened at 6:32pm by President Teresa Jones at the Olathe Christian Church. January birthday people were asked to stand and be recognized. Visitors were Pam Thomas, Kathy Parker and Sheri Keller. Sheri joined the Guild this evening.

Program Chairman Mary Ellen Winter introduced Denise Stahl, the 'Curious Kansas Quilter.' She gave a program with a slide show titled, "How I Became Quiltworx Crazy," aka a 'Judy Junkie.' Ms. Stahl is a Certified Judy Niemeyer teacher who works and holds classes at Mea Bernina and Baby Lock in Lawrence, KS.

Cheryl Lowrance asked for a vote on the Block of the Month, whether to ask members to bring 1 yard or 1 ½ to share. One and a half yards was chosen.

There was a 20 minute break to view the speaker's products and shop at the Ways and Means Garage Sale collection of notions. Next month there will be pin cushions, fabric totes, and microwave bowls. In February please bring items for the March sale, which will focus on cutting tools, scissors, rotary cutters and cutting mats. Bookmarks are available with the monthly list.

When the business meeting resumed, Libby Corrison made a motion to approve the minutes of the December meeting as printed in the newsletter. It was seconded and approved. Susan Gandy made a motion to approve the treasurer's report as printed in the newsletter. It was seconded and adopted. The proposed budget was distributed on each table. There was one question about no budget shown for the domain name and Sherri Critchfield answered that it is a 3 year contract, already paid. Mary Ellen Winter made a motion to adopt the budget as printed. It was seconded and approved.

Sherri Irving thanked those who signed up for the Charity Committee and encouraged anyone who wanted to join us to let her know. You don't have to be a member of the committee to contribute charity quilts or work on ones already started. She then shared that we have quite a few tops ready to be made into quilts, and that we hope to have a few sew days this year with the first being a 'B & B' sew day to prepare batting and backing for quilt 'kits.' Please let Sherri know if you want one of the kits.

Teresa announced the next board meeting will be Tuesday January 21st at 6:30 in the same meeting room at Olathe Christian Church. All members are welcome to attend. There are new business cards and bookmarks. Sherri Critchfield, who had them printed, has deposited some at four quilt stores so far, Quilted Sunflower, Quilters HQ, Harpers, and Quilters Haven, and has more in mind. Heather Schaller will take some to the Johnson County Extension Office. Members are encouraged to take some and pass them out to interested parties.

Mary Pacey has a list of the Extension classes coming up. The January class will be string quilting, and will also teach backings. Mary Ellen listed future programs. February's speaker will be Karen Hill, "The Dresden Queen," trunk show and lecture. Lisa Hirsch needs help with quilting, binding, and organizing ticket sales for the Opportunity Quilt. Kenda Camp volunteered to do the binding, but please see Lisa if you will handle the other areas. About the Fires in Australia, Ruthie Hoadley said there are plenty of mittens, but pouches are needed for the marsupial babies, called joeys. She has addresses and instructions. Members are invited to come early to meetings, at 5:45 pm, to help set up the extra white tables needed for the meeting.

A volunteer is needed to take over the Ways & Means Elect position. Becky Tenney had to resign to take care of her husband who is suffering the effects of Agent Orange.

Block of the Month – Carolyn Chaffin announced the result of voting for the 2019 winners: Best use of stripe – Sheila Pierce; Favorite – Gretchen Ryan; Best setting – Pam Pearson. Carolyn also explained the BOM again. It is based on the Row by Row program. She will provide a block pattern each month and any number can be made into a row. The first one was a pinwheel, and there was also an extra 4 patch pattern which may be used to fill in spaces in the quilt.

The Welcome Table reported attendance of 60 with 3 visitors, one of whom joined. The winner of the drawing was Ava Wright. The Membership Committee held a drawing for one person to receive a refund on their annual dues when paid before the end of the year. Karen Lacy was the winner.

Challenge Quilt - Cheryl Lowrance asked everyone to bring 1 ½ yards of batik to the next meeting. It will be cut in ½ seven times and shared. The challenge is to make a quilt with the fabric by November. Two more fabrics may be added.

Carol Crane requested that the Show and Tell go a little slower so the quilts can be admired longer, and the backings shown. The participants in Show and Tell were Carolyn Chaffin, Sheri Keller, Mary Whitchurch, Pauline Sanders, Pam Pearson, Heather Schaller, Cindy Nice, Janie Bernander, Kenda Camp, Peggy Bayard, Linda Hagen, Jean Heer, Heather Buchwitz, Anna Mae Wagner, and Teresa Jones. Charity quilts were shown by Sherri Irving.

Pam Pearson declared 2020 the Year of the UFO (Un-Finished Object.) Her plan will appear on the Guild Facebook site. Members are invited to join her for lunch at 11:15 at Panera Bread at 20120 W 153rd St, Olathe, KS 66062. Turn west on 152nd St from 169 Hwy. Meetings will be four times this year to celebrate four categories. The first date will be March 7th to see your Project Blue Book entries – one project from a while ago (!) that you have finished or want to finish.)

June - Crop Circles - (Bring a project that you are hungry to finish or satisfied that you did finish!)

September - Men in Black - (Bring a project with SOME black in it that you started 10 minutes or ten years ago!)

December - Ancient Aliens - (Bring your oldest project, finished or not.)

It was noted that Quilted Sunflower in Bonner Springs is closing. They will have a 60% off sale on Super Bowl weekend.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:26.
