Committee Updates

Hello Quilters! Let's talk OPPORTUNITY QUILT!

First of all – thank you to all who were able to come & help cut up & kit fabrics with Melissa & I!

Secondly – we will have kits for pickup at both February & March meetings. We ask that the blocks come back to the next meeting. We will have a few finished examples at the February meeting.

Included with the newsletter email is a pdf with the quilt design (so you can see each block) & the decoder-ring with each block labeled. The third page is the sign-out sheet so you can see what is in each kit & what we guessed at the difficulty. Some are difficult just due to the quantity of blocks in the kits.



This is a choose-your-own adventure. Want easy & small? Take 1-2 single block kits! Want a challenge or love paper piecing? Take something bigger or harder!

We have 29 kits total. We hope to have some sew days at Quilters HQ if you want some guidance sewing yours together.

Ok – but what do you really want us to do?

Great Question!

- We have cut pieces using templates for each section of your block & laid the fabrics out on top of the papers in their proper places.... So be careful pulling your kit out of the baggie!
- Once you have your block(s) out of the baggie carefully pull the paper out from under the fabrics. For some blocks this won't matter but the more challenging/smaller piece blocks it may.
- The paper is labeled with the color in case you get confused. Start with A1. If you have multiple sections complete them all in order & then you can connect them together.
- Trimming Please trim the fabrics as you piece (use your ¼" ruler) so we don't have a lot of bulk on the back side. For the finished block -if you have a one-section block feel free to not trim. If you have a multi-section block you will need to trim. There is a dashed cut line that should be the block size. You may want to leave ¼" outside that line to make life easier for those piecing the rows together (They will trim when they do this step). PLEASE PIN the block name to the top of the finished block.

Outreach Committee

"Hi all - as part of our outreach work this year, we are working on some new things and continuing some of our popular events. We are planning a set of classes at the K-State Extension office, so look for that schedule to come out in March. A special thank you to Cindy Nice and Mary Pacey for their efforts to present classes for the public!

We have been asked to get some volunteers to assist in the Extension's beginning sewing class, to be held in June (dates TBD). Over 2 sessions, we would need to assist attendees, whether it's in sewing a straight seam, winding and loading bobbins, threading machines, etc. They use Janome domestic machines, so pretty simple to support, even if you don't have one yourself. If you are interested, please let me know if you can join me in helping others learn this wonderful craft.

I mentioned it in January's meeting, and we're working to make our first quilt show in over ten years happen! We're looking into some venues and hope to lock that in soon, planning for a fall show. For now, I would like your input for items we could make and sell at the event to boost our funds (along with selling opportunity quilt chances, of course). I love the idea of mini quilts, but would love other ideas - it doesn't all have to be one thing either, we can have a variety! We could even sell quilts if you have some you aren't in love with, or can easily make for the event - while we might normally gift those quilts through our charity team, if we sell them it gives us more resources to use for all our efforts. Right now I think if we made some Chiefs throws or other items, we could name our price! Please contact me if you have ideas.

We're also planning on other types of ideas for events, partnering with local institutions like the school district or Mahaffie Stagecoach Stop & Farm, etc. Not all of it may work out this year, but we're trying to think of how to get out in the community to promote our guild and have fun sharing our love of quilting with others! If you want to join the fun for one or more of these activities, join me on this committee! "
