Extension Classes: Our first class at the Extension Office is **Tuesday April 23rd from 6-8pm** to make a "burrito" pillowcase, and registration is now open! <u>Sign up online</u> (if this link does not work, go to the main Extension class page at <u>www.johnson.k-state.edu/classes-events</u> and look for the **Sewing Class: Pil-lowcase**). Please share this information with friends and family - this is a great class for beginners or any-one wanting to "dress up" your pillows!! It's a great way to update your bedding without making a whole new quilt or buying a new comforter. Use a really special fabric and have fun! We also need volunteers to assist attendees - please contact me if interested.

Also - we are still **seeking a volunteer (or two)** to be the instructor to teach a summer sewing camp this June, since the regular instructor is not available. The dates are still being finalized, but will be split over two sessions on June 12th & 13th. The attendees will be making easy projects like a pillowcase and tote bag. <u>Mahaffie Events</u>: we have a change to the events we will do at the Mahaffie Stagecoach Stop & Farm. We are cancelling the April 27 event as I am out of town and we already have an Extension class that week. So our two events for Mahaffie are the Independence Day: 1860 Style Living History event on Saturday July 6, and then Grandparents Day on Saturday Sept. 7.

EnsorFest: Saturday May 11 at The Ensor Park & Museum, at 18995 W. 183rd St. We have been invited to have an outdoor display of quilts, where we can talk to attendees about our guild and sell tickets for our Opportunity Quilt. On the afternoon/evening from 1:00 PM - 7:00 PM of Saturday May 11, 2024, our guild is collaborating on an event with the <u>Ensor</u> Park and Museum in Johnson County called Ensorfest 24! Their group has asked us to develop a quilt display. In return, we get a chance to enjoy a historic homestead and share our guild with the public.

What do we need?

Quilts! We envision hanging around 20 quilts outdoors on the tree-shaded clothesline with clothes pins.

- If you are willing to volunteer one of your quilts for afternoon in the park, let me (Melissa Toburen) know, my email address is on the Member roster).
- Quilts will be collected after our April meeting. Details to follow via email.
- How do I get my quilt back? We will ensure they are safe! You could pick them up at Ensor at the end of the evening yourself, or at our next guild meeting. Other arrangements can be made as needed.

Volunteers: Quilt Watchers and Opportunity Quilt Sales!

- Two people for 2-hour shifts for each job type. The early birds get to help hang quilts on the line and/or set up the Opportunity quilt.
- Our spot will be in the shade. We recommend bringing a lawn chair. Food trucks with beverages will be available for purchase but bringing your own snacks and/or beverages is allowed. (This is a Johnson County park so alcohol is not permitted.) Portapotties are provided.
- We thought it might be fun if our volunteers also had some quilt related project sewing they could "demonstrate".




