


Our July Speaker Patti Meier

Seeking Quilts and Quilt Watchers!

On the afternoon/evening from 3:30 PM - ~9:30 PM of Saturday August 12, 2023, our guild is collaborating on an event with the Ensor Park and Museum in Johnson County called Ensorfest 23. Their group has asked us to develop a quilt display and in return has allowed us to sell Opportunity Quilt tickets!

What do we need?

Quilts! We envision hanging 14-20 quilts outdoors on the tree-shaded clothesline with clothes pins.

If you are willing to volunteer one of your quilts for afternoon in the park, let us know (Rachel and Melissa, our email addresses are on the Member roster).

Quilts will be collected at the August guild meeting. We'll ask that you complete a short "bio" about the quilt that we can type up, print, and attach (with a binder clip, no pins!) to the quilt.

How do I get my quilt back? Rachel will keep them safe. You can pick them up from her on Sunday, August 13 or arrange to do so later – unless you are at the park yourself and want to tuck your own in at the end of the night.

Volunteers: Quilt Watchers and Opportunity Quilt Sales!

Two people for 2-hour shifts for each job type. The early birds get to help hang quilts on the line and/or set up the Opportunity quilt.

Our spot will be in the shade. We recommend bringing a lawn chair. Food trucks with beverages will be available for purchase but bringing your own snacks and/or beverages is allowed. (This is a Johnson County park so alcohol is not permitted.) Porta-potties are provided.

The Pheasant Pluckers bluegrass band starts at 6:45 PM – if that helps you decide what shift you do (or don't) want.
