March K-State Extension Workshop Presentation Tuesday, March 23 from 6-8 p.m.

Techniques for Using Heirloom Textiles

This class is all about techniques and will cover a wide array of heirloom & memorabilia fabrics and how to use them in quilting projects. We will cover how to stabilize fabrics, deal with damage, sample project ideas and more. Specific textiles we will be discussing are handkerchiefs, doilies, t-shirts, neckties, embroidered heirlooms (towels, pillow cases), and photos or other artwork. Bring your pencil, paper & list of your heirloom fabrics to get your questions answered.

Enroll for the workshop on the K-State Extension Office web site under Classes and Events. Any handouts will be emailed to those who registers, along with the link to the Zoom presentation. On the day of the presentation, you will get a **link to the Zoom meeting** in your email which opens the meeting for you to be a participant. You do not need a camera or microphone built into your computer in order to view and hear the presentation.


Ways & Means and "Quarantine Quilt"

Not sure about the proper sizes for charity projects? Wondering how many "points" you will earn for making a charity project? Block of the Month

Hope you are enjoying making your stars. Here is how to cut your fabrics for this month's block:

- A. Cut 2 squares 2 7/8 of background print.
- B. Cut 2 squares 2 7/8 of a dark print
- C. Cut 8 squares 1 1/2 of another print
- D. Cut 5 squares 2 1/2 of background print.

Here are the instructions:

1. Draw a diagonal line through the A background squares. Pair them with the B squares of dark print. Sew 1/4 inch on each side of the line, cut and press—this makes 4 half-square triangles.





2. Draw a diagonal line through 4 C squares, place them on the half square triangle you just made. Sew on the line, cut and press.





3. Use the last 4 C squares to go around one D background square.



4. Arrange blocks with the remaining 4 D background squares to form two stars in one.

See how I used two different fabrics for the background with the same value.

KCRQF Update (contd.)

KCRQF MERCHANDISE DETAILS

It's time to start ordering merchandise for the 2021 Festival! Contact Heather Buchwitz for any questions.

Q – How do I order?

A – Use this link - https://bit.ly/2021kcrqfGuildPreOrder

Q – Is Olathe Quilt Guild subsidizing our tickets again?

A – YES. In past years Olathe Guild has provided \$5 towards your single or 3day ticket purchase. You can purchase tickets for friends – but you only get a single \$5 discount. You only get this if you order through the above link.

Q – Should I order via the www.kcrqf.com website?

A – Preferably not. The orders through the KCRQF website for merchandise will not be deliverable prior to the show, tickets purchased through the website will not qualify for the \$5 guild subsidy. That said – you totally CAN. If you are signing up for a class & want to order your Tshirt & pin there feel free. You will have to pick it up at the festival.

Q – What if I change my mind?

A – If you order through the PreOrder link above you have until the end of March to let Heather or Mary Ellen know that you changed your mind. If you order through kcrqf.com the order is not refundable or editable.

Q – How do I pay?

A – Rachel Rohrer will receive a list of Olathe Guild member orders & send you an invoice. She will be using Square to make the invoices and you will see it come in your email. It won't be same-day – we (KCRQF) are not sending out daily updates to guilds of orders at this point. You may not see your invoice for a few weeks.

Q – Ok I'm getting an invoice – but how do I pay?

A – The Olathe Guild board has agree that we will use Square – but we WILL lose part of your payment if you pay by credit card. The board would LOVE if you mail a check to the P.O. Box. The address will be on your invoice. If you mail in cash or check the guild keeps all of the money to pay KCRQF for your order. We understand that doesn't work for everybody and near the end of March you will likely not have time to send in a check in time.

Q – When is payment due to Olathe Quilters Guild?

A – As soon as possible when you receive the invoice. Any orders not paid by 3/31/2021 will not be guaranteed. The festival will order some extra merchandise but it will be sold first-come first-serve. Olathe will not include your order in the guaranteed merchandise order we submit on 3/31/2021 if we do not have your payment to send along to the festival.

Q – Where & when will I pick up my merchandise?

A – Tentatively Mary Ellen & Heather (on behalf of the festival) are planning to distribute merchandise to all of the guilds in May. After that point all of the guilds will have to figure out their own distribution process. We are planning (for Olathe Guild specifically) to distribute at our May or June meeting which will hopefully be in person! If we don't have an in person meeting (at least in the parking lot) we will set up a date & time to meet at the church & let you come pick up. If you don't pick it up then we will have it at the merchandise booth for pickup during the festival.

Q – Can I buy a ticket at the festival?

A – Yes – but nobody wins except the OPCC in that scenario so PLEASE plan ahead! We will continue to take ticket orders up until the end through the pre-order link & the KCRQF website.

Meeting Minutes

Olathe Quilter's Guild Meeting Minutes February 9, 2021

The Zoom meeting was available at 6:15 pm with host Karen Genis for questions and conversation. The general meeting of the membership of Olathe Quilter's Guild was opened at 6:30 pm by President Libby Corriston. 48 people were present on Zoom. Libby welcomed two new members, Bev Cunningham and Adrienne Clevenger, and visitor Julie Coons.

Program: Mary Ellen Winter introduced Kelly Ashton who gave a program called, "Fussy and Fabulous – Let the Fabric Work for You," with emphasis on placing parts of a print in the shapes to be pieced.

Business Meeting:

A motion to approve the secretary's minutes of the January meeting was made by Cheryl Wilcox, seconded by Shelia Pierce and approved.

The Money Market account ending date within the treasurer's report was amended to the date December 31st, 2020. Melissa Toburen made a motion to accept the report as amended. It was seconded by Lisa Hirsch and passed.

Those with February birthdays were recognized.

Orders for KCRQF tickets and merchandise: If placed through the link provided by Heather Buchwitz, the orders have had invoices issued by the treasurer, Rachel Rohrer. These may be paid on the Square app by credit card, or by sending a check to the guild post office box. If paid by check the fee charged by Square is avoided, but either method is acceptable. Festival tickets may be ordered through the June guild meeting.

Officer position: A volunteer is needed for the Program Elect position; please contact Libby Corriston.

K-State Extension: Fourteen people completed the Beginning Quilting series by Lynda Ochs. Mary Pacey will demonstrate Bullseye Quilts on February 23rd.

Challenge Quilt 2021: Sherri Irving explained the plan to make a quilt using only two colors, but tints and shades are acceptable. The quilt may be any pattern or size, and finished by the end of the year. There will be prizes!

Block of the Month 2021: Linda Hagen directed attention to the star block pattern sent in the newsletter. The blocks will be 6 ½ inches, intended to be a stash buster, to be set as you please. She suggested that the colors be of similar value against a contrasting background. Prizes will be awarded.

Membership: Jean Heer reported 59 members have paid dues. She drew a name from those who paid by the end of January, and Karen Genis was the winner of a refund of her 2021 dues. The newest update of the membership roster was included with the newsletter email.

KCRQF: Heather Buchwitz encouraged members to sign up for classes now, and Mary Ellen Winter pointed out they are filling up fast. Changes to selections may be made through the end of March. Volunteers are needed for the guild booth and opportunity quilt, merchandise sales, and quilt hanging. Susan Gandy will demonstrate hand quilting. Heather answered questions: all classes are now listed, and the festival will be held unless the city shuts it down.

Kathleen Manning referred to the application form for showing a quilt which was sent in the February newsletter and is on the website. The form and photos should be sent to her by the end of February.

A volunteer is needed to organize the volunteers for the festival opportunity quilt booth. Please let Teresa Jones know. Libby has instructions from last year.

Charity Committee: Cindy Nice showed a lap size fidget quilt that would be appropriate for seniors. She has 24 kits to distribute to make tea towels for Habitat for Humanity. Next month she will have kits for pillowcases.

Website: Melissa Toburen will welcome suggestions and comments.

Program for March will be the selection of quilts to be shown at the festival. Kathleen Manning has a spinner to choose them at random. The number to be shown will depend on the sizes. Enough quilts are needed to fill up the space allotted – they don't have to meet expectations of perfection! Mary Ellen Winter will also hold the drawing for the Covid Geometry Quilt. Tickets are available on the Square site.

At the April meeting, Diane Murtha will present a Virtual Lecture called "Challenges." Accept the challenge and win a prize.

Welcome Table: Shelia Pierce drew the name of Ava Wright to win a fat quarter.

Ways & Means: Four people bought chances on the drawing, which was won by Teresa Jones. \$16 will benefit the committee.

Zoom Tips

Tips for joining Zoom:

Downloading the Zoom client

You can download the Zoom Desktop Client for Mac, Windows, ChromeOS and Linux, as well as the Zoom Mobile App for iOS and Android from our Downloads page.



Joining another user's meeting

There are many ways to join a meeting, but the easiest way is to click the join link that the meeting host provided. You can also click **Join** in your Zoom client and enter the meeting ID.



As a guild member, you will receive an email with the Zoom link to join our monthly meeting. At the time of the meeting, you will click on the link to enter a Zoom meeting room. You click the "Join" button pictured above. Please make sure your name is entered into your profile. Then meeting host will admit you to the meeting.

The guild asks that everyone keep their microphone on **Mute** so we can hear the presenters and speakers.

Here are a few more tips to remember:

- If you keep your camera on, remember we can see everything you do and everything happening behind you.
- In the bottom center of the screen is a "Chat" feature. You can send messages to the whole group or private messages to individuals.
- If you have a question for the speaker, please put it in the "Chat".
- If you invite a guest, please let Karen Genis know, so she can let the guest into our Zoom meeting (since she is the host, she can admit people to our Zoom meeting even if they are not a guild member).
