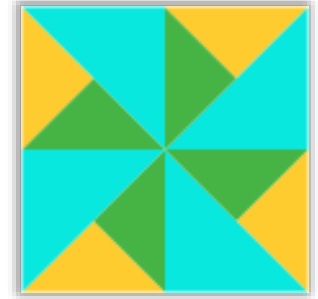

Dear Olathe Quilters Guild Members,

In July we took a really conservative approach to having our guild meeting on Zoom rather than in-person. The board has now discussed what to do going forward, since it appears that COVID, and in particular the very transmissible BA.5 variant, will be with us for quite some time. We have been watching the CDC guidelines, our local Johnson County stats, and the wastewater data. Moving forward, our plan is to meet in person each month unless local or federal guidelines indicate we should not. Each month we will determine whether our area is at a Low, Medium or High Community Risk Level, and then advise as to the wearing of masks. Right now, according to the CDC, our area is in the high transmission point, which means everyone should wear a mask to attend indoor meetings. Our local positivity rate is actually higher than it was last month. For the sake of all of us, we'll keep as socially distant as possible. If you don't feel comfortable attending in person, please join us on Zoom. If you have COVID, please do not come to the live meeting, but join us on Zoom. As usual, the Zoom link will be sent out a few days prior to the meeting.

On another note, when guests visit us at a meeting when we have a speaker, which is nearly every month, they pay \$5 to attend. That value will be applied to their membership fee if they join within a few months. This policy will also hold for guests attending by Zoom. If on Zoom, they can send in the money to our P.O. Box 2651, Olathe, KS, 66063.

And finally, it is time to create our slate of officers for 2023. We hope that you will consider being a part of the board! See the note later in the newsletter for details.

As you receive this newsletter, we will be in the middle of handling the quilt open section at the Johnson County Fair. I hope to see you and your quilts there!

## Modern Sunflower

Modern Sunflower was chosen by Kansas City Modern Quilt Guild to represent the state flower of Kansas, the sunflower. It is a modern deconstructed version to honor the modern quilt aesthetic.

### Cutting Instructions

**Fabric A** – yellow

- ✓(1) 1 1/2" x 7 1/2"
- (1) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2"
- ✓(1) 4 1/2" x 12 1/2"
- ✓(1) 3 1/2" x 7 1/2"

**Fabric C** – raspberry

- ✓(2) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2"
- ✓(2) 1 1/2" x 8 1/2"

**Fabric E** – white

- ✓(1) 2" square
- ✓(1) 2" x 1 1/2"
- (1) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2"



**Fabric B** – lime

- ✓(1) 1 1/2" square
- ✓(1) 2" x 1 1/2"
- ✓(1) 3" x 5 1/2"



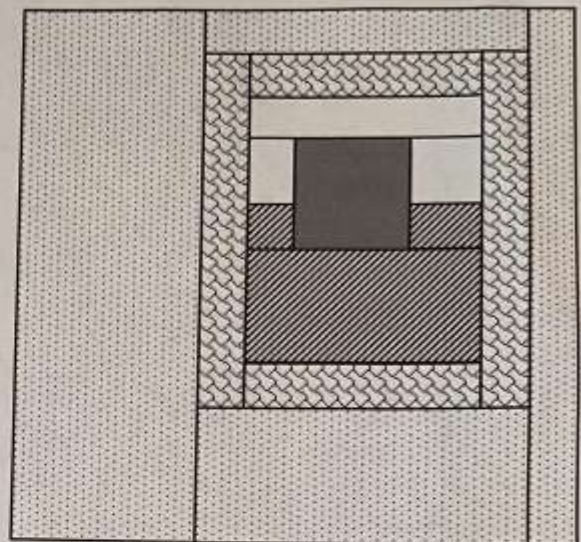
**Fabric D** – blue

none

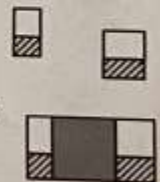


**Fabric F** – black

- (1) 3" square

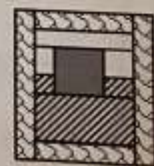


Sew the 1 1/2" side of Fabric E 2"x1 1/2" rectangle and Fabric B 1 1/2" square to create a 1 1/2"x3" unit. Sew the 2" side of Fabric B 1 1/2"x2" rectangle and Fabric E 2" square to create a 2"x3" unit. Sew these units to each side of the Fabric F square making sure the Fabric B is on the bottom.



Add the Fabric B 3"x5 1/2" to the bottom and Fabric E 5 1/2"x1 1/2" strip to the top.

Frame the unit by adding Fabric C 1 1/2"x5 1/2" strips to the top and bottom. Then add Fabric C 1 1/2"x8 1/2" strips to each side. This unit measures 7 1/2"x8 1/2".



Sew Fabric A 1 1/2"x7 1/2" strip to the top and the Fabric A 3 1/2"x7 1/2" strip to the bottom. To complete this modern block, add Fabric A 1 1/2"x12 1/2" strip to the right side and the final piece of Fabric A 4 1/2"x12 1/2" to the left side. Block size is 12 1/2" square.
