


September Blocks of the Month

Coming in 2024

Quilters – Are you up for something new? How about joining a Round Robin or a Row Robin? The concept is simple. A Round Robin is a group of "Robins" where each "Robin" starts with their center piece, or block. The first round is where you hand off your center block to another "Robin" and they will add a border to it. The next month, it is passed off to the next "Robin" to put another border on. The quilt top grows each month as the next "Robin" will add a border. We can have a uniform set of rules, such as the size of the border, or we can go 'free-style' and see what happens.

A Row Robin is where everyone makes their first row (we would set the width). The rows are passed each month and the next "Robin" would make a row based on what they receive. Just like a Round Robin, this Row Robin can be very structured or more 'free-style'.

So what do you think? Would you like to join a Round Robin or a Row Robin? Does a uniform set of Rules or "free-style" work for you? You could contribute fabric for your "Robins" or let your "Robins" pick what they feel works with your block or row. Let us know what you think you might like to participate in. Depending upon the number of quilters, we might have several groups based on what you would like to do. We would set the groups up and the order in which to pass the quilt top at each meeting.

Plans are to start passing our initial center block or row at the first meeting in 2024 and have a quilt top (at least) made by the end of the year. If this sounds like fun, let us know you want to be included. Email Sherri Irving or Ava Wright. You can also let us know at the Guild meeting.

Ava has provided a few pics of quilts from Round/Row Robins that she has participated in.
