

KCQRF Guild Quilt Entries - A Couple of Reminders

If you have entered a quilt in the KCRQF festival, be sure to:



- Measure the sleeve on the back of your quilt to assure it is 4" high.
- 2. Attach a label to back of your quilt, lower-left corner preferred.

It should list name of quilt, your full name, address, and phone number.

To ensure impartiality in judging, please apply a fabric flap (sewn or carefully pinned) on top edge only, covering the label.

Note: The May newsletter will contain more information on dropping off & picking up quilts after the festival.
