## **Construction detours for getting to Olathe Christian Church**

### **Directions for getting to Olathe Christian Church for the Olathe Quilters Guild meeting**

Though conditions on Ridgeview are improving, currently the best ways to get to the church are:

Coming from the north:

Just east of the I-35 and 135<sup>th</sup> St. intersection, take Clairborne Rd. south about 1.3 miles.

At E. Sunvale Terrace (not Sunvale Drive), turn right/west.

Take Sunvale Terrace to Ridgeview and then drive across Ridgeview to the church.

Coming from the east and south, come in on 151<sup>st</sup>:

Turn north onto Lindenwood Drive. Drive about 0.7 mile.

Turn left/west onto Sheridan Bridge Lane. (You'll head west and then southwest.) Drive about 0.2 mile.

Turn right onto Stagecoach Drive and drive 0.5 mile. (You'll be heading northwest.)

Cross Ridgeview into the church parking lot.

# Meeting Minutes

Olathe Quilter's Guild Meeting

October 12, 2021

The regular meeting of Olathe Quilter's Guild was begun at 6:30 pm with a welcome by President Libby Corrison. Then she presented the speakers for the evening program, members Melissa Toburen, Maribeth Kehl and Rachel Rohrer. They showed slides of their trip to the 2020 International Quilt Show in Tokyo, Japan, talked about their trip, and showed many items they brought back.

The business meeting began with a motion by Kathy Kolodziejczyk to accept the minutes of the September guild meeting. It was seconded by Gretchen Ryan and approved by the members. A motion to accept the treasurer's report was made by Karen Lacy, seconded by Heather Schaller and approved.

The President wished a happy birthday to those with October birthdays.

Election: Libby noted that the slate of officers was posted in the newsletter. Volunteers are still needed for an additional person to help with Program Elect and Ways and Means Elect – those who will step up in 2023. Current board members were asked to come to the front and be recognized. Then the newly nominated officers joined them. Maribeth Kehl made a motion to elect the slate, which was seconded by Gretchen Ryan, and the vote was affirmative.

Committee sign up: Libby thanked all who served on a committee this past year. Sign-up sheets were placed on a table so during the break people could choose for the coming year. In November committees will meet to decide a chairperson and discuss ideas.

Committee reports:

2021 BOM - Linda Hagen announced 2 more months to finish a quilt using the 10 star patterns she has shared. The quilts will be voted on at the December meeting.

2021 Challenge – Sherri Irving has allowed until February to turn in the two-color quilts. It's not too late to start!

Charity – Cindy Nice had 3 quilt kits prepared to make easy quilts, and reported lots of finished quilts turned in.

Outreach – Mary Pacey reported that there will be one more K-State Extension class this year, called Fast Fusing Fun. She asked that items for the fidget quilts be turned in at the November meeting.

Opportunity Quilt – Planning, making and marketing takes two years to completion, and the next one will be shown at the 2023 Regional Quilt Festival. The drawing for the current one is in November.

Programs – The November presentation will be "All About Threads" and the December event will be the Guild's 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

Special Events – Heather Schaller asked if people preferred authentic Mexican tacos or an American version. The theme for the anniversary will be 'Feliz Navidad.'

Welcome Table – Shelia Pierce explained the duties of that committee.

Correspondence – Carol Crane read two thank you notes. One was a from the Family of Amber Evans for the quilt given to her at the Olathe Hospice House. The other one was from Eva Gavin for a quilt which raised money in an Alzheimer's Fundraiser.

Transportation – Libby asked if people had trouble getting around the road construction to the church. Unfortunately the construction changed after instructions were sent out.

Heather Schaller offered free thread.
